The aim of this assignment is to select one TOK Exhibition Prompt and analyze a single object that meaningfully connects to that prompt.

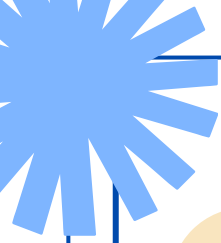
Your task is to explain how this object represents knowledge, questions knowledge, and relates to key TOK concepts.

- How is the value of knowledge determined?

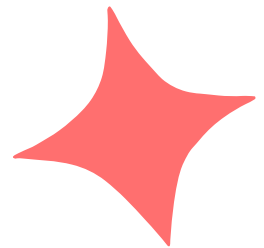
